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A New Era – Exploring the Possibilities and Expanding the Boundaries

Theme

Libraries, archives, and information services of all types are exploring the possibilities for promoting information, culture, and knowledge through the development of their collections and serving as community meeting, learning and creative spaces. This is seen in three areas: 1. construction of unconventional and cutting-edge buildings and redesigning of old buildings, 2. adoption of new virtual solutions for making services, programs, exhibitions, and events accessible, 3. increased digitization of collections and acquisition of new media. Collectively, developments in these three areas have expanded the boundaries of what constitutes an information service, how they operate, and ways services are delivered. Bobcatsss 2023 will explore the possibilities for services and programming and the expansion of physical and virtual boundaries in this new era for libraries, archives, and information services.

Submissions may address the following topics, or other relevant subthemes:

- Literary and cultural mediation

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Types of Contributions and Submission

The scientific committee welcomes and encourages submission of high-quality, original contributions which have not been previously presented or published elsewhere, in the form of a paper, poster, Pecha Kucha presentation, workshop or panel.

Abstract submission ([EasyChair](#))

- Abstract: 300–500 words, 3–5 keywords
- All accepted papers will appear in the proceedings of the conference.
- Selected papers will be published in high level international scientific journals.

All proposals will be refereed in a double-blind process and must follow formal guidelines. Proposals will not go forward for review if these guidelines are not observed. The conference language is English and all work should be in English. If English is not your first language, we strongly recommend that your manuscript be edited by a native English speaker.

Please note that at least one of the authors must register for the conference in order for a paper to be accepted and published in the proceedings.

Authors' notification on final decision on abstract category: October 10th, 2022

Notification of acceptance for papers: December 12th, 2022

Deadline for submitting final versions of papers: January 4th, 2023

Conference Dates: January 25 – 27 2023

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Submission Guidelines

Following a double-blind review process, authors will receive notification email. Even if their proposals/abstracts are accepted authors might be asked to revise abstract of their proposal, according to the reviewers' remarks and suggestions.

Papers should be submitted as attachments via EasyChair (as .doc, .docx or .rtf). Paper length is limited to 8 pages (minimum 2,000 and maximum 3,500 words), including the first page and the following content:

- The background and purpose of the study.
- Details of the methods, procedures or instruments used.
- Findings, discussion and conclusions.
- References/Bibliography (not included in word count)
- Appendices (if necessary)

Posters and PechaKucha presentations should be submitted as attachments via EasyChair (as .doc, .docx or .rtf) and limited to two pages, including the first page and the following content:

- The background and purpose
- Details of the methods, procedures or instruments used
- Findings, discussion and conclusions
- References/Bibliography (not included in word count)
- Appendices (if necessary)

Workshops and Panels should be submitted as attachments via EasyChair (as .doc, .docx or .rtf) and limited to two pages.

Workshop proposals should include:

- The background, purpose and expected outcomes of the workshop.
- Details of the methods, procedures or instruments used.
- Discussion and conclusion
- References/Bibliography (not included in word count)
- Appendices (if necessary)

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Panel proposals should involve between three and five speakers and include the descriptions of the core idea for the panel as well as short descriptions (300–500 words) of all included papers. Once accepted, please aim to follow the guidelines for paper submissions.

The first page of all submissions should include the following:

- Title: 15 point Times New Roman font
- Author(s): 12 point Times New Roman font Author's name, academic title (for teachers: Assistant professor, Associate professors etc.) or student status (Bachelor, Master or Doctoral student), affiliation (Department, School, University), city, country, email address.
- Abstract: An abstract of maximum 300 words should be included on the title page. Use 10 point Times New Roman font in italic face.
- Keywords: List 3 – 6 keywords.

Important: Try to prepare inclusive presentation which will be accessible to all potential audience, including people with disabilities.

Requirements for style and format:

- Formatted for A4 paper using MS Word or Rich Text Format with minimal use of formatting.
- Right and left margins should be aligned and justified.
- 12 point font in Times New Roman style only, single-spaced.
- First level section headings should be in boldface and subsection headings in italics
- Sections should NOT be numbered.
- Tables and figures should be incorporated in the text as close to the reference as possible, and sequentially numbered in separate series. Captions should be Times New Roman style 10 point, centered. Captions for tables should be above the table. Captions for figures should be below the figure.
- The author is solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of the references. References should be listed alphabetically according to the last name of the author. References to personal letters, papers presented at meetings, and other unpublished material should also be included. The format for citation follows the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA). Citation of an author's work in the text should follow the author-year citation format. Use comma to separate last names, and the word "and" between the last two authors within the text. For example: "Smith (1999) found that..."; "other researchers (Black1 PechaKucha is a presentation which includes 20 slides that are shown for 20 seconds each (6 minutes and 40 seconds in total). BOBCATSSS 2023 will be hosted on the OsloMet campus. The campus is easily accessible on public transport and is located walking distance from many of Oslo's major cultural and historical sites. The University is equipped with modern conference facilities.

Hybrid attendance will be offered. One of the main goals of the conference is to explore how hybrid academic conferences can be further developed to reduce costs, span geographic distances, and find climate friendly solutions.

Conference registration fees will be kept to a minimum – a benefit of holding the conference at OsloMet!

The Swedish School of Library and Information Science is Sweden's most extensive research environment in the subject and conducts research and education with a strong professional connection and international character. This year, 2022 we celebrate 50 years working as a spearhead for library and information science education and research within Sweden.

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This research area deals figuratively with the sense-making of information and in a concrete way with how it may be organized, made searchable, accessible and mediated through different techniques and information services. The research emphasizes conditions and methods for individuals and organizations to get hold of desired/relevant information for different activities, education, training and experiences.

Library and information science focuses as well on library and information services as on how individuals or organizations search, use and get access to information. Conditions are studied as well on micro as macro level and include aspects of cultural policy and/or informational policy.

The area Library and Information Science in Borås is the largest within its discipline in Sweden, with 6 professors, 20 senior lecturers and more than 10 lecturers. At present, there are almost 20 doctoral candidates in our research programme.

The PhD programme, which is also the most comprehensive in Sweden within the discipline, is closely related both to the undergraduate programmes as well as to the school's research groups. Both researchers and doctoral students participate in networks and international conferences and work in cooperation with external partners in the relevant professions.

First call for papers

The International Conference on **Digital Transformation and Inclusiveness of the Higher Education Institutions in the Time of Crisis Situations** is planned as one of the Multiplier Events of the Erasmus + project **DECriS** (Digital Education for Crisis Situations: Times When There is no Alternative). The conference will be held in **Osijek, Croatia May 23–24, 2023**.

The main goals of the DECriS project are tackling future skills mismatches and promoting excellence in digital skills development; ensuring HEIs contribute to innovation and inclusive digital education and strengthening connectivity at international level. In the line with EC's goals, DECriS project intend to focus on the development, testing, and promotion of flexible and modular OERs design and their placement on the project's platform; integration of work placements in online environment. The project also aims to build evidence about what works in HEIs about DE during COVID–19 primarily, but as well other crisis situations through studies, expert groups, and analysis and monitoring of benchmarks and indicators.

We invite (L)IS community to join us in Osijek, Croatia for two DECriS project conference days May 23–24, 2023 which be followed by International Conference – LIDA 2023 (Libraries in the Digital Age) on May 25–26, 2023.

The Department of Information Sciences, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, University of Osijek, a member of i–Schools movement, will also mark 25th anniversary of its establishment (www.ffos.hr) during the conference.

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Thus, plan your trip to Osijek and Croatia, as there will be a number of interesting events (invited lecturers, workshops, accepted papers and panel discussions).

Your proposals are welcomed as research papers, short papers, posters and panel proposals. For research papers we would expect proposals no longer than 7 000 words; for short papers the limit is 3 000 words. Poster and panel proposals should have not more than 1 500 words.

Proposed sub-topics for **DECriS** Conference are:

- Digital Education (DE): approaches, strategies and organisational models
- DE supporting equity, inclusion and internationalization of higher education (HE)
- DE in the time of crisis: innovative practices and solutions
- Virtual reality and game-based learning
- Emergency online teaching: experiences and best practice
- Emergency online teaching and mental health issues
- Trauma-informed teaching and learning
- Mobile teaching
- Pros and cons for DE in the time of crisis
- Teachers' and students' perception and expectations of DE
- Users' experience and satisfaction with hybrid and DE; best practices
- Pedagogical approaches to the DE
- New methodologies and digital competencies for DE
- Innovative curricula and educational methods in DE
- Digital testing and assessment
- Impact of hybrid and DE on learning outcomes and higher education in general
- Digital transformation: the role and expected impact of information institutions on higher education
- Open Educational resources (OERs): perception, experiences, challenges
- (Quality) evaluation of OERs: approaches, case studies, views from different perspectives and experiences
- Internship and apprenticeship in the time of crisis: perception, experience, challenges
- Digital internship
